## SECTION 4: First aid measures

### 4.1. Description of first aid measures

Take care of your own safety. If any health problems are manifested or if in doubt, inform a doctor and show him information from this safety data sheet.

#### If inhaled

Terminate the exposure immediately; move the affected person to fresh air. Protect the person against growing cold. Provide medical treatment if irritation, dyspnoea or other symptoms persist.

#### If on skin

## SECTION 5: Firefighting measures

### 5.1. Extinguishing media

### 5.2. Special hazards arising from the substance or mixture

### 5.3. Advice for firefighters
